The Exhibition grounds will be open Monday, September 14th from 8 a.m. to 10 p.m. All Exhibitors must register on Monday, September 14th to receive exhibitor number, tags and bracelets.

Livestock must remain on grounds until 9p.m. Saturday, September 19th.**

**No livestock will be admitted to the grounds before 8am Monday,
September 14th, 2008.**

**No campers or trailers will be admitted to the grounds before 8 am
Sunday, September 14th, 2008.**

**Entry forms with payment in full must be returned by September 4, 2009
Draft horse, oxen and beef exhibitors are required to pay \$1.00 class entry
fee per class. This is payable with the entry form. If it does not accompany
the entry form the class fee will then be \$2.00 per class. All Draft Horses
entering pulling competitions are required to pay \$5.00 per head Drug Test
Fee to be forwarded to the EANS.**

**Camping fee of \$60.00 (Tax Included) may be paid upon arrival at the fair
Grounds. Non-Exhibitor fee is \$15.00 per night (Tax Included).**

basis. Priority will be given to mares with foals and stallions. Anyone
requesting a box stall must pay a \$20.00 box stall fee which must accompany
the entry form.**

1. Horses, cattle and other livestock will be received on Monday until 9:00pm. Unavoidable delays will be dealt with at the discretion of the appropriate committee.
 2. The fair grounds will be open to the public on Tuesday through Saturday at 8:00am and close at 11:00pm.
 3. Judges of livestock will meet at the manager's office on Tuesday at 9:00am to pick up their books and proceed to judge classes as scheduled. On completing their judging, these books are to be signed and returned to the Manager's office.
 4. No cattle of any breed under 3 months of age shall be allowed to compete for prizes.
 5. Pedigrees of all purebred animals over one year of age shall be shown at the time of judging. For purebred animals under one year of age the name and number of sire and dame shall be submitted by writing at the time of judging. Grade animals are the progeny of a purebred sire.
 6. Animals low in flesh or otherwise inferior character, unworthy of a place in exhibition, will not be admitted under any circumstances.
 7. All livestock must be entered by September 2nd, 2008.
 8. Safety of Exhibits: Though the association will take reasonable precaution to insure the safety of articles sent or brought to the exhibition, yet it must be definitely understood that the owner themselves must assume all risk. Should any article be accidentally injured, lost or stolen the association will give all the assistance in its power toward recovery of the same, however it will not make payment of the value thereof.
 9. All livestock must be shown in the ring by owner's attendants. In estimating the value of livestock the Judges will take into consideration where animals of different ages are competing with each other.
 10. No animal or article can compete in more than one class or in more than one section of the same except as a herd.
 11. No reward or money prize not offered in the list will be paid except it be highly recommended by the Judges.
 12. It does not follow that because a prize is offered for any particular animal or article, that it must be awarded unless there is proper competition or unless the exhibit is of sufficient merit to warrant the award being made.
 13. Exhibitors can ascertain from the Superintendents in charge of several departments, who will be named later, when the judges will examine their exhibits. No complaint based upon the statement that Judges overlook animals or articles will therefore be entertained by the executives.
 14. Livestock for competition or exhibit shall not be removed from the grounds before 9:00 pm the closing day of the exhibition.
15. Exhibitors must supply proper fastenings for safely securing the animals in stalls. The committee Will not be responsible for any injury or accident to any animal during the time of the exhibition, or on the exhibition grounds.
16. Five members of the general committee shall form a quorum for the transaction of business.
 17. Any exhibitor infringing any of these regulations shall forfeit all or any of the prizes that may have been awarded to him.
 18. Prize colors: 1st Red, 2nd Blue, 3rd White, 4th Green.
 19. No person shall be allowed to interfere with the Judges while in the discharge of their duties. Exhibitors so interfering Will forfeit their right to any premium to which they might otherwise be entitled. This rule is strictly enforced.
 20. Payment of premiums will be made during the two week period following the closing of the fair, by cheque through the Mail. These cheques are to be cashed by the end of November. Exhibitors are urged to have their prize accounts checked at the fair office the day following the close of the fair.
 21. All hauling contests will be judged on a percentage basis unless otherwise stated.
 22. All entries to the fair are to be recorded on any entry form supplied by the committee for this purpose and are to be Presented to the manager's office at the time of entering the exhibit.
 23. Try as we may, we cannot always avoid mistakes, but we can and will cheerfully correct them. Please call our Attention to any mistakes.
 24. All Livestock trailers will be parked on the fair grounds as available parking space is limited.

NOTE: All Livestock must remain on the fair grounds at all times during the fair. Exercising of draft horses, oxen or light horses to be done on grounds either in the small show ring or for draft horses in the area at the rear of the grounds. The only exception being participation in the parade on Wednesday.

ALSO: All horses over three (3) years old are required to be shod.

All Camper and Livestock trailers are to be parked on the grounds as the parking lot will be used for day parking only. Entries for Special Pulls will enter through the Co-op Road gate to attain parking.

HORSE PULLING RULES FOR STAY-ON PULLING

1. All horses entered in contest are to be weighed without harness, on the day of the event where possible.
 2. All teamsters taking part in pulling contests to draw for pulling position.
 3. Only one teamster to one team. Helpers are allowed when hooking to drag or during an accident or breakage. Other than that, they must stay behind the front end of the drag at all times, once hooked to the drag. Only the teamster, and or helpers can go to the head of the horse to adjust equipment and then only once during a pulling match. The team will not start until the teamster is behind the evener, with reins in his hands. If they do, you will lose that start.
 4. Lines in pulling ring to be 11 feet apart. (Inside Measurement)
 5. Pulling distance to be 3 feet in one continuous motion.
 6. Once hooked to the drag your first start is a free start and it does not matter if you step out. After this free start you must stay between the rails at all times. Where possible the rails should be of 2x4 construction. (Full hoof print outside rail constitutes a disqualification.)
 7. Time Limit of 15 minutes will be allowed for repairs. A three minute remaining warning will be given
 8. Each Movement will constitute a start, at the Judge's discretion.
 9. Starting loads will be: Single - 1400 Lbs., Double Light - 2600 lbs, Double Medium -3000 lbs. Heavy Doubles - 3400 lbs. Light teams will weigh no less than 2400 lbs. No Single horse in any team to weigh less than 1100 lbs. If the committee wishes they may request that a horse be weighed separately to ensure that it is over 1100 lbs. Horses below that weight will not pull, as they are considered to be a pony. Light Class - 2400-2799 lbs, Medium Class - 2800-3199 lbs., Heavy Class 3200 - Plus lbs.
 10. All placings in pulling contests to be on a percentage basis. Exception to system of pulling to be made for a special pull.
 11. Horse teams to be disqualified from pulling in any contest if any animal be blemished or in poor condition . Decision of judge and/or committee is final.
 12. Each individual horse may only be entered in one class per day at a pulling contest. There is absolutely no switching of horses from one partner horse to another partner horse to enter a second class on the same day. Anyone caught switching individual horses from one team to another after weigh in will be eliminated from that pull and dealt with at the discretion of the judge and/or committee.
 13. All teams to pull in the same direction and pull to a finish.
 14. Drag Loading: Not less than 400 lbs., and no more than 1200 lbs, at any one start until pull is completed.
 15. Any Teamster judged to be intoxicated by alcohol or drugs will not be allowed to pull in that contest, at the discretion of the judge and/or committee. If any teamster is deemed to be in violation of this rule, a review board will be convened and appropriate disciplinary action taken against that member.
 16. No Whips allowed with horses. No cruelty to be tolerated on exhibition grounds to any animal. No profane language to be used during contest. Light use of reins, forward of hands is allowed. No butt ends or drag slapping.
- (Rules continued)

(Pulling rules continued)

17. Each exhibition to set their own times and class order for contest.
18. There will be no jumping in any pull. First infraction, you will lose the start, second jump you will be eliminated from the contest.
19. There will be only one finish line, cross pieces at end of rails. Drag is behind this finish line when it is time for another load, you will still have 3 starts left to complete that load.
20. All horses in pulling contest are to be shod at the start of the competition.
21. Do not leave horses unattended at the pull, or you will be eliminated.
22. The judge's decision is final. No teamsters will be allowed to abuse the judge at any time.

NOTE: Teamsters are encouraged to collect awards "with their team". Not only is this a crowd pleaser, it also encourages sponsorship. As we all know, sponsorship and crowd approval are important to our sport

Rules will be given out at the time of weigh in and drawing for placings. Any questions will be answered prior to the start of pulling.

NO LIVESTOCK WILL BE PERMITTED TO LEAVE THE GROUNDS AFTER REGISTERING THEIR ENTRIES ON MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 14TH - WITH THE EXCEPTION OF THE TIME SPENT PARTICIPATING IN THE PARADE ON WEDNESDAY - UNTIL THE CLOSE OF THE FAIR ON SATURDAY AT 9 PM SEPTEMBER 19TH, 2009.

IT IS A REQUIREMENT of the Exhibition Association of Nova Scotia that each Horse entered in the pulling competitions must pay \$5.00 per head Drug Testing Fee to be forwarded to the EANS to cover random Drug Testing costs. This fee will be charged on your entry form.
