OPEN SHOW ALL WEEK LONG

Anyone choosing to day show must enter and exit from the Coop Road Gate.

Horses and Ponies that are showing for entire week and are using stabling are required to be on the grounds by 10:00 p.m. Monday September 19 , 2011 and must stay until 9:00 p.m. Saturday September 24 , 2011.

We will not guarantee stall space for Day Showing.

Box stalls are limited in number and preference will be given to stallions and mares with foals.

Proof of Insurance Must Accompany Entry Form.

Entries Close September 12th , 2011.

Waiver on Entry Form MUST be Signed

Entries that are paid in full will be processed in the order in which they are received.

Light Horse Entry Fees , Class Fees and Exhibitor Pass must Be Paid in Full and Accompany Entry Form or They Will Be Subject to Post Entry Fees

DO NOT send Box Stall fee with your entry form.
If you get a Box Stall then it must be paid for upon arrival at the fair grounds.
Please include a note with your entry form as to why a Box Stall is required

Car Passes and Camping Fees may be paid for upon arrival at the fair.

Rules and Regulations For Light Horse and Pony Classes

1. This is a non sanctioned show , however it follows set Rules and Regulations.
2. In cases where there is some questioning concerning the rules governing a particular class , **The Judges Ruling Will Be Final.**
3. Any one 18 years of age and under must wear protective headgear with an attached harness while mounted anywhere on show grounds.
4. Use of helmets by riders 19 years of age and over is optional (unless otherwise stated), but is recommended for these riders in all timed events.
5. No stallions are permitted in any Youth , Pee Wee , Beginner or Pony Class.
6. Height of horses - 14.2 hands and over . Ponies - under 14.2 hands.
7. Horses age shall be calculated as of January 1 of the current year.
8. Horse 5 years of age and under can be ridden with 2 hands on the reins and a snaffle bit without shanks or bosal in any class. All other horses entered in Open Western Classes (excluding Gymkhana) are to be ridden with one hand on the reins and only one finger between the reins , unless otherwise stated.
9. Age of rider shall be determined by Rider's age as of January 1 of the current year.
10. **Back number must be visible at all times** . If you choose to place number on saddle pad it must be on both sides of the saddle pad. Riders will receive a warning for first offense about incorrect back numbers or not wearing a back number , after that it may result in elimination for that class.
11. Timed Events . Any Rider crossing the start line without a hat or helmet in place will be eliminated. Deliberately tipping off hat or helmet after crossing start line will not be tolerated. First time you will receive a warning , second time will result in elimination.
12. Western Classes (Gymkhana and Performance) - Horses to be shown in western tack and handler or rider to be in western attire which consists of long sleeve shirt, long pants ,western boots and western hat or a helmet. .
13. No martingales , tie downs , nosebands , draw reins , mechanical hackamores, crops splint boots or bandages allowed in any Western Pleasure , Trail , Equitation, Command or Maritimebred Class.
14. In classes where a crop is allowed maximum length will be 75 cm.
15. Fall of horse and / or rider in any gymkhana class or race results in elimination.
16. Entries will be processed in they order in which they are received.
17. Class Fees and Horse Entry fee must accompany entry form or they will be subject to post entry fees , unless otherwise stated. There will not be any switching of entries from one Class to another.
18. Class Fees and Horse Entry Fees will not be refunded unless a veterinary Certificate is provided
19. Show will retain 20% of class entry fee for Stake and Jackpot classes. Remainder will be paid out in prize money.

20. Exhibitors must notify the Light horse Office if they are scratching from classes.
21. BIT RULE. At the discretion of the judge or Ring Master , bits may be checked in any class, any bit that is either illegal or inhumane will not be allowed.
22. Flat classes which have both horses and ponies entered , at the judges discretion may ask the horses to lope or canter separately from the ponies.
23. Horses and ponies must be under control at all times . Any entry felt not to be in control may be asked to leave the ring at the judge's discretion.
24. Show officials reserve the right to change the program or classes if deemed necessary.
25. The rules and regulations of this show are automatically agreed to by the exhibitor by signing their entry form.

Pattern to be posted the day of class , riders responsibility to know pattern. Judged on rein manners and appointments. Off pattern will result in elimination. Splint boots , run down or skid boots or protective bandages are permitted.

212. OPEN REINING . Open to Horses and Ponies Horses and Ponies entering this class will be expected to perform flying lead changes , spins and sliding stops. Pattern will be posted 1 hour before the class .

A good trail horse has the ability navigate obstacles with safety , alertness and caution. Pattern will be posted one hour before class. Riders responsibility to know pattern.
