1. The main building will be open Monday from 12 noon to 6 p.m. for the reception and arrangement of articles. NO articles will be accepted after 6.p.m. Monday. Judging of the Main Building Exhibits will begin at 6 p.m. Monday evening.
2. The Fair grounds will open to the public Tuesday through Saturday from 8 a.m. to 11 p.m. daily.
3. Judges for the Main Building exhibits will arrive at the Main Building by 6 p.m. to receive the Judge's books and supplies, then proceed to award prizes. On completing the judging, etc. they will sign the books and return them to the Manager's Office.
4. All articles for competition, except livestock, should be the production or manufacture of the Exhibitor and made in the current year.
5. No person shall be allowed to enter for competition more than 1 specimen or required quantity of any one section. This does not apply to livestock.
6. Safety of Exhibits: The association will take reasonable precaution to insure the safety of all articles on display but all Exhibitors do so at their own risk. Should any article be damaged, lost or stolen the association will do everything in it's power to recover the same but is under no financial obligation for the value of the item.
7. On the entry of each article a card will be furnished to the exhibitor on which is specified the class, section and exhibitor number. This card is to be attached to the article during exhibition.
8. No award or money prize not offered in the prize list will be paid except it be highly recommended by the Judges.
9. No entry shall be given a prize because it is the only one in the class. All prizes will be awarded with a view to a certain standard of excellence and prizes for best exhibits means for excellence. The design, amount of work, etc. is of secondary importance.
10. Therefore, it follows that just because a particular prize is offered, it does not have to be awarded unless there is proper competition or unless the exhibit is of sufficient merit to warrant the award being made.
11. Exhibitors can ascertain from the Superintendents of the Departments, when the Judges will examine their exhibits. No Complaint based upon the statement that Judges overlook animals or articles will, therefore, be entertained by the executives.
12. Articles in competition in the Main Building shall not be removed before 10 a.m. on Sunday, September 20, 2009
13. Five members of the general committee shall form a quorum for the transaction of business
14. Any Exhibitor infringing any of these regulations shall forfeit all or any of the prizes that may have been awarded to him.
15. Prize Colors: 1st - Red 2nd - Blue 3rd - White 4th - Green.
16. No person shall be allowed to interfere with the Judges while in the discharge of their duties. Interference will cause forfeiture of awards. This rule strictly enforced.
17. All entries of preserves, canning and pickles will be opened for Judging. Note rule #9. All labels to be removed.
18. All entries to the fair shall be recorded on an entry form provided for that purpose and shall be properly filled out with contact information, then returned to the Office.
19. Try as we may, we cannot always avoid mistakes, but we can and will cheerfully correct them. Please call our attention to any mistakes.
